The monitoring of species and communities can take many forms. One of the key divisions is perhaps between that which is conducted by paid workers, and that which is done in a volunteer capacity (e.g. 'citizen science'). This talk will outline some of the various attributes and successes of both types of monitoring as conducted in the UK, for plants, over the 20th and 21st centuries.

Jodey Peyton - is a botanist working at the CEH in the UK. Her interests are invasive species and she has worked on numerous projects involving landscape-scale habitat and species surveys.

Dr Oliver Pescott works within the UK Biological Records Centre where he supports the use of plant species occurrence data, collected primarily for 'Atlas' projects, in ecological research. More recently he has also in led the development of a structured, plot-based plant community monitoring scheme (www.npms.org.uk).
